In this report I have enclosed photos of some Cu ore I found in a small creek when I was walking on this lease These samples were found after 200mm of heavy rain in this area, I gave a geologist (a University teacher) look at the sample and she said It was potently high grade Cu, the colour, the weight, the crystal formation The sample was a intense sky blue colour, and because it was in a air tight container it kept it blue colour the sample on the ground had oxidised when exposed to oxygen and which made it hard to find that area and I had to go back to my gps co-ords. I will get TerraSearch from Townsville to walk this area with a ground mag survey.

Their fees are 10k to get here and back and \$1,600.00 per day – have had a meeting with Simon Beams who owns TerraSearch and Travis Davies who is the field manager. We talked about when is the best time to go and how to get there and who to talk to at the property thay (tera search) wanted to come back to town every day this will be possible on these leases in the vic river area as its 72 km to a road house .All the ground meg survey infomation will have to stored till thay can get to 240 v power source These tracks are very hard on your gear/equipment On one of my exploration walks i found a rock high in P/b&A/g the way i tested it was for lead was to lick it, it was sweet, to find out weather it contained A/g i put a couple drops of .5 of 1 % clorine from an eye dropper on the sample and if it bubbles and turns black it has an A/g content ,this procedure was showen to me by Prof Tom Blenkinsop head of environmental sciences @ James Cook Uniiversity When i am out here i drive to the target area than get out and walk ,when you drive you miss to much and when the station owner see a set of tire tracks thay follow them think that some one is stealing there equipment or killing one of there cattle for meat EL30669) is 32 blocks/100 sq km a big area for one person to look at ,its a long way out (600km one way) and very isolated so i stay for a few weeks at a time ,last year it rained very heavy over 200mm and i was stuck out there for weeks thats when i found the Cu deposit **Anthony Wright**
