A FOSSICKING SITE BUT THERE ARE FEW AVAILABLE
AND I DO NOT WANT TO LOSE THIS LEASE. ACCESS TO
THIS LEASE ON JINDARR STATION IS DIFFICULT AND
THE SITE HAS NOT BEEN BURNT FOR SEVERAL YEARS
GIVING FEAR TO TOURISTS WHO ARE NOT KEEN ON
WADING THROUGH LONG DRY GRASS THENSE WE HAVE
DARWIN FOSSICKERS, BIRD WATCHERS AND THOSE WHO
JUST LOVE TO BE IN A REMOTE, QUIET SECLUDED
AREA WITH MUCH TO OFFER BESIDES A FEW PRETTY

ROCKS TO COLLECT.

I HAVE SENT MANY TO THIS SITE TO VIEW THESE WONDERS MY LEASE PROVIDES.

A LADY FROM THE N.T. WHO IS REGARDED AS ONE OF THE BEST RELATING TO BIRD LIFE AND ANIMALS ALONG WITH A JUDGE OF THE N.T. SUPREME COURT AMONG THEM ARE AMAZED AT WHAT MY LEASE OFFERS AND ENJOY VISITING MY SITE.

SO MANY CARAVANERS APPROACH ME AT THIS PARK WHERE I RESIDE IN A LOANED CARAVAN AND ASK ABOUT THE ROCKS I HAVE ON DISPLAY IN THE RECEPTION AREA. I EXPLAIN TO CONVEY THEM I WOULD NEED A MINIMUM OF FIVE PERSONS, THE DURATION OF TRAVEL TO THIS SITE, THE CONDITION OF THE DORRISVALE ROAD AND TRAVELLING IN A TROOPS CARRIER REALLY PUTS THEM OFF, THEY GO AWAY VERY DISAPPOINTED BECAUSE THEY LOVE THE ROCK SPECIMENS I SHOW THEM.

THIS SITE WHEN I PEGGED IT IN 1999 RAISED VERY MUCH INTEREST IN YOUR DEPARTMENT AND IN INTERVIEWS WITH SENIOR PERSONNEL IT WAS PUT TO ME THAT MINES DEPARTMENT WOULD LIKE TO HELP IN ANY WAY AND EVEN SUGGESTED THAT YOUNG GEO'S COULD BE SENT FROM UNIVERSITY TO SPEND TIME ON THE LEASE, NOTHING CAME OF THIS.
